

# WHAT IS GOODWILL BRINGING TO WEST LOUISVILLE?

As members of the West Louisville community follow along and witness the Norton Healthcare Goodwill Opportunity Campus take shape at the corner of 28th Street and Broadway, some might wonder – what exactly is it? The answer is in the name – it's an opportunity.

Opportunity is at the heart of Goodwill Industries of Kentucky's mission to serve the underserved. That's why it's making its biggest mission-related investment in its 100year history to help the underserved West Louisville community get a hand up, not a handout, to take steps to exit poverty.

At the Opportunity Center on the campus, Goodwill will co-locate with community partners to help participants assess needs and overcome barriers to employment, including addictions, justice-involved backgrounds, education deficiencies, limited workforce histories, childcare challenges and transportation.

Co-locating partners include Big Brothers/Big Sisters, KentuckianaWorks, Volunteers of America, Park Community Credit Union, the Kentucky College of Barbering, University of Louisville School of Dentistry, Legal Aid Society and the YMCA.

The Norton Healthcare Goodwill Opportunity Campus is expected to provide 300 full-time jobs with average salaries of \$60,000. Goodwill's Opportunity Center on the campus is expected to serve more than 50,000 people every year and help place more than 600 job seekers into full-time employment with businesses throughout the region that pay a minimum of \$13 per hour – creating a cumulative annual impact of \$18.7 million.

#### **GOODWILL IN THE COMMUNITY**

On June 30, members of Goodwill's West Louisville Advisory Council, which was created by the nonprofit to help it understand many of the deep-rooted needs, challenges and priorities of people who live in West Louisville, got a firsthand look at the many programs and services Goodwill offers.



The council toured the Metro Louisville Opportunity Center at 909 East Broadway and Goodwill's South Louisville Campus at 6201 Preston Highway, which features the South Louisville Opportunity Center, The Excel Center®, Goodwill's tuition-free high school for adults, and the 2nd Chance Outlet retail store. They gained an indepth knowledge of Goodwill's programs and social services and will share those details in their respective networks to ensure the West Louisville community is fully aware of the resources coming to its area.

The advisory council includes 11 members who live or work in West Louisville and represent a diverse combination of businesses, nonprofits organizations, religious establishments, Metro Council districts and professional expertise. Goodwill took part in the Alberta O Jones Park Day on July 8, which featured more than 30 community organizations along with local small businesses and family-friendly activities. It was the first AOJ Park Day and was organized in celebration of the construction currently happening at the park, located at 2310 Maple Street.

Goodwill will also be present at the Unity Jam event with Norton Healthcare on July 29 at noon at Shawnee Boys & Girls Club at 317 N. 38th Street. The event will allow residents of West Louisville to sign a construction beam used for the West Louisville Hospital and forever be part of the structure.
